



This is what they learned about mothballs:



- \* They have almost 100% pesticide ingredient
- \* We can <u>NOT</u> use them in gardens, yards, attics, or under a home
- \* We can use them inside airtight
- \* Inside airtight containers, mothball vapors are released and build up to kill clothes moths
- \* If you can smell their odor, you are breathing in the pesticide
